To the Chief Musician. A Psalm of the sons of Korah. A Song for Alamoth.

1. God *is* our refuge and strength,
A very present help in trouble.

2. Therefore we will not fear,
Even though the earth be removed,
And though the mountains be carried
into the midst of the sea;

3. *Though* its waters roar *and* be
troubled,

Though the mountains shake with its
swelling.

4. *There is* a river whose streams
shall make glad the city of God,
The holy *place* of the tabernacle
of the Most High.

5. God *is* in the midst of her,
she shall not be moved;
God shall help her, just at the
break of dawn.

I will be exalted in the earth!

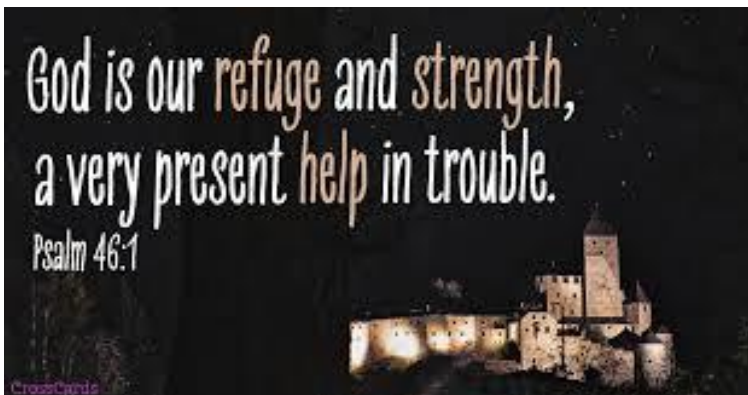
11. The LORD of hosts *is* with

Explanation of Psalms 46

- Often referred to as Luther's Psalm because the great reformer was accustomed to singing it in times of trouble. This psalm has been paraphrased in his hymn A mighty fortress hymn 506 The SDA Hymnal
- This Psalms reminds us that **in the midst of the upheavals of nations, Gods people are safe**
- The themes that are expressed in this psalms are very relevant to the last days.
- The Psalms is thought to be written by David and has a unusual layout for a Hebrew poetry.
- There are 3 stanzas which are practically equal in length with refrain and selah appropriately placed.
- The descriptions in the psalms are striking contrast. Roaring waters rocking mountains, a quiet river, nations in turmoil and God ruling quietly above the nations.
- After a notable victory in the days of Jehoshaphat, the Israelites sang this hymn(PK 201 and 203).
- It is closely linked to Psalm 46, 47 and 48 all these are thought to share the same background.

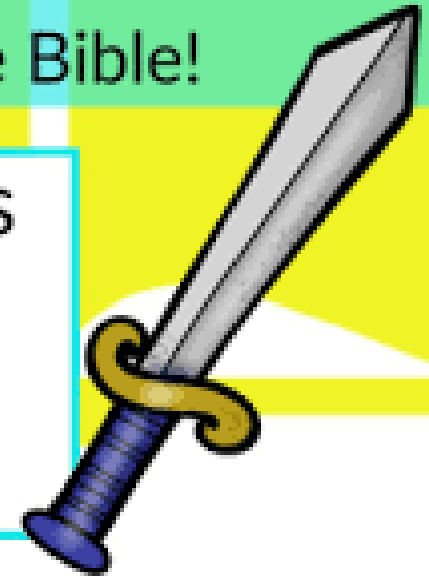
